Some Tips:

- Check out several systems before making a decision.
- Test the system to make sure it is easy to use and works from every point in and around the user’s home. Make sure nothing interferes with transmissions.
- Read the purchase, rental, or lease agreement and warranty carefully before signing and get any questions resolved, such as what would happen if a parent died before the contract expiration.
- Find out if the system can be used with other response centers. For example, can the same system be used if you move?
- Be wary of high-pressure sales tactics.
- Check the local Consumer Protection Agency, state Attorney General’s Office, and Better Business Bureau (BBB.org). Ask if any complaints have been filed against the companies being considered.
